



Have you recieved a diagnosis of cancer during pregnancy or within the 12 months of giving birth?

#### for me

The news of a pregnancy or a recent birth is usually an exciting time for all prospective and existing mums. It can however be cruelly interrupted by the news of a cancer diagnosis and the worry that this brings to both you and your wider family. Worse still, this could have also led to the loss of a pregnancy or a baby. Our aim is to help you get the support you need during this upsetting and uncertain time.

We are specifically set up to offer that support if you find yourself in this situation and we hope that by providing a compassionate team along with emotional support, comprehensive information, links to support services and information on employment rights and financial/home claims, we'll be able to help you on your cancer journey.



Has a family member or friend recieved a cancer diagnosis during pregnancy or within 12 months of giving birth?

#### For someone close

A cancer diagnosis can impact in ways that are often unseen for the partner, children, parents, siblings, friendship circles and work colleagues.

People often don't realise that they are struggling to help their loved one and may need support themselves

We try to offer support in a number of ways, from suggestions as to how you can offer practical help, pick me ups for mum, how to find support for you, information about our grants programme and also advice and support about entitlements that you may be unaware of. We are able have a support forum for partners and for the wider family to access.

#### Christmas Parties

The swimming lessons will take place at Queens Park Health & Fitness Centre and transport will be arranged by school.

Below are the swimwear requirements set by the local authority.

'Pupils should be encouraged to wear swimming caps during the lessons or hair must be tied back. Correct swimwear must be worn at all times.

Girls must wear a one-piece swimsuit (no two piece at all). No Wet Suits.

Boys must wear swimming trunks or shorts of no longer than mid thigh length with no pockets (no Bermudas or long shorts are acceptable as these can become dangerous when the pockets become full of water). No Wet Suits.

No Jewellery to be worn including all types of earrings.

Any child attending the pool without the correct equipment will not be allowed to swim.'

Any armbands/floats etc will be provided.
