<u>Y6 PGL Holiday 2022 – 15th–17th June 2022</u>

All Year 6 children recently received a letter about next year's PGL holiday.

If your child is attending, the amount of £300 has now been added to your child's SchoolMoney account. It has been set up so you can pay as much as you want, when you want, but please ensure that at least £100 is paid by the Christmas break. The full balance will need to be paid by Friday 1st April 2022.

The cost of the holiday is $\underline{£300}$ per child. This does not include spending money. We allow the children to have $\underline{£6}$ spending money. As this will be held by staff on the holiday, we ask that the $\underline{£6}$ is handed to the school office any time <u>from now until June</u>. Please send this as $6 \times \underline{£1}$ coins (in an envelope please) so it can be easily distributed to the children on each day at PGL. Thank you.

<u>Winter Uniform</u>

After the half term holiday all children should be in full winter uniform.

Boys Uniform

<u>Girls Uniform</u>

Red round-neck school jumper or red school cardigan <u>displaying the Chapel End</u> <u>Primary School emblem.</u> White polo T-shirt Plain grey pinafore, grey skirt (appropriate length) or grey trousers Grey tights Grey socks (recommended for Winter) Black Shoes

<u>Haircuts</u>

We do not permit children to have extreme haircuts such as shaved patterns or mohican styles as they are inappropriate for the school setting. We would ask that hair is no shorter than a clipper setting of number 2 and any child, male or female, with a long hair length will be asked to tie their hair up.

Hair Accessories

We ask that hair accessories such as headbands, clips, bows and bobbles are red or black in colour. Please also ensure that they are kept to an acceptable size and keep them as plain as possible.

Nursery

Children of Nursery age are permitted to wear black or grey jogging trousers to support gross motor skill activities and toilet training.

<u>Underlayers</u>

Due to increased ventilation in school and the weather becoming colder, we would like to remind parents and carers that children can wear underlayers sometimes referred to as 'skins' beneath their normal uniform or PE kit.

Dinner Money Payments

Please note dinner money is paid **<u>in advance of the week</u>** via SchoolMoney. Dinner money is now $\pounds 2.50$ per day ($\pounds 12.50$ per week).

When you log on to SchoolMoney the figure shown is your current balance either in credit or debit as at that particular day.

Debit Balance

Please remember to pay the figure that is shown as owing **plus** the cost of any remaining meals due to be taken by your child for that week.

Credit Balance

If your balance is in credit, please ensure you have enough credit for any remaining meals due to be taken by your child for that week. If not, a further payment will need to be paid to bring your account up to date.

Fish Friday Payments

Please remember Fish Friday is paid **in advance of the term.** Fish Friday next term is **£17.50 (7 weeks).** Please follow the same instructions above.

Admissions to Secondary School - September 2022

REMINDER: Parents of Year 6 pupils will have received a letter from St Helens Council (or Wigan Council if you are a Wigan resident) about applying for a secondary school place for September 2022, outlining how you can apply online. NB: The closing date for applications is: **31**st October 2021.

Admissions to Reception - September 2022

To qualify for admission to Reception in September 2022, children must be aged four on or before 31st August 2022. If your child attends a nursery in St Helens, you should have received a letter from St Helens Council outlining how you can apply on-line. NB: The closing date for applications for Reception 2022 is **15th January 2022**.

DID YOU KNOW?

Most collisions involving children occur in late afternoon, when they are walking home from school or playing outside.

 Most child pedestrian fatalities were
due to running or not paying attention at the time of the collision.

While all children are vulnerable around roads, some children are more at risk than others - boys are twice as likely as girls to be killed or severely injured.

Most road collisions occur on short journeys closer to home.

12 children under the age of 10 are killed or injured as passengers in cars EVERY DAY.

> Car seats prevent deaths and serious injury. Make sure you

have the right seat for your child:

CAR SEAT CLASSIFICATIONS

- Babies (up to 13kg, group 0+ seats)
- Toddlers (9-18kg, group 1 seats)
- Children up to 12 (15kg upwards, group 2 and 3 seats)

O Using the correct child car seat limits injury in the event of a crash.

All children under 12 years old or under 135cm in height must use a child restraint.

Not all car seats will fit all cars. Choosing the right one for the weight and height of your child is important. Make sure your child car seats are easy to fit.

Try your car seat before you buy it, buying new will guarantee it hasn't been damaged previously.

• If your child is travelling with other people, ensure the correct car seat is used.

PRIVATELY OWNED POWERED SCOOTERS

It is illegal to use powered scooters on public roads, on pavements, in cycle lanes and pedestrian-only areas.

The reason for this is that powered scooters are currently classed as 'powered transporters' by the Government.

Learning to ride and cycle training.

- Good places for children to learn to ride a bike are gardens, parks and playgrounds. Avoid steep hills and areas close to busy roads
- Small children may need stabilisers to help them balance. Some balance bikes are sold without pedals which allow children to scoot along
- For older children, cycle training helps them gain confidence and to know how to safely control their bikes
- Many schools offer Bikeability training or can signpost you to training in your area.

CYCLING SAFETY

Follow these top tips to keep you and your children safe when cycling:

Be seen, be safe.

• Wear bright clothing, preferably something fluorescent and reflective

• Use lights and reflectors in the dark and in poor visibility

- Children should wear correctly fitting cycle helmets without any damage
- Check the condition of the bike prior to each use, including brakes and tyres.

When buying a bike, size does matter!

Buy one that is the right size for your child. Avoid the temptation to buy one they can grow into, or one that is too small.

A bike is the right size if a child can:

- Reach the handle bars without stretching
- Sit in a position where they are not leaning too far forward
- Reach and easily use the brakes
- Touch the ground with the toes of both feet while seated on the saddle.
