Summer Reading Challenge 2023

Ready, Set, Ready

1 in 5 children cannot read well by the age of 11. This hugely limits their life choices and skills. We're on a mission to change this and we need your help!

We invite you to encourage your children to take up the **Summer Reading Challenge**. It's the UK's biggest reading for pleasure programme for children aged 4 to 11, delivered via public libraries.

Children can sign up at their local library from July 10^{th.}

Last year, in St Helens, over 1500 children joined the Challenge and we would like to beat that number this year!

For children who took part in 2022:

- 77% read more over the summer holidays
- 75% improved their reading skills
- 71% felt more confident about their reading

How it works:

- Children sign up at any library in St Helens and receive a collector folder as well as a tote bag with a free book.
- They borrow 6 books of their choice during the summer, collecting special stickers.
- Library staff and volunteers help children to discover new books that suit their interests and reading level and run a programme of free themed activities in the library.
- · Children who complete the Challenge are presented with a certificate.

The summer school is aimed at children who enjoy playing their instrument or singing and want the opportunity to work with other tutors to improve their musical skills. This will be a great opportunity to have fun, try different instruments and make music. The days will be split up into a variety of rehearsals and workshops with the chance to learn new music, develop their musicianship and instrumental skills along with interacting with other musicians. There will also be a creative music workshop delivered by international renowned film composer, Bill Connor as part of this year's summer school.

Children will need to arrive for 8:45am on both days and be collected at 4:00pm from the main entrance of St Helens Town Hall. They will need to bring a packed lunch for each day and should wear comfortable clothes. A tuck shop will be run throughout the day offering a selection of snacks and drinks, pupils may wish to bring a small amount of money with them in a purse or wallet. Please bring an instrument, if applicable.

The cost for the two days is £37.00. If your child would like to attend, please book online using the QR code below. Siblings are also eligible for discount with a reduction of fees to £20.00. Once booked, we will send you a consent form which you will need to complete in full and email back to musicservice@sthelens.gov.uk.



Should the full cost of the day prohibit your child from attending please contact the Music Service office to discuss our remissions policy.

Places are limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis, so we recommend booking as soon as possible, with places only being booked once payment has been made online.



Swimming in or playing near rivers and canals may seem like a great idea, particularly on a warm day, but it could all end in

tragedy. DON'T take the risk.

THE WATER IS COLD...

...even on very warm days, rivers and canals contain water barely above 10 degrees. Sudden immersion can lead to cold water shock, which can cause gasping and intake of water.

This can be deadly in a matter of seconds.

DID YOU KNOW?

Even the narrowest of rivers can be considerably deep. Rivers are subject to strong flow and **hidden currents** which can trouble even the strongest of swimmers.

WHAT LIES (BENEATH?



The water is untreated and can make you ill.

Canals and rivers contain pollutants, sewage and often unseen underwater obstructions and snag hazards.

Debris under the water such o as shopping trolleys, broken glass and cans can cause injury or trap you.

Remember, there are no lifeguards to help you at your local river, lake, canal or dam.



Rivers can be very difficult to climb out of, especially with steep or slimy banks. Stay clear of rivers with steep or unguarded banks.



IN AN EMERGENCY... NEVER enter the water to try and help a person or animal. You could get into difficulty yourself. Instead, dial 999 and use any water rescue equipment that is available.

If you fall into the water unexpectedly, fight your instinct to thrash around. Instead, lean back, extend your arms and legs & float.

MERSEYSIDE FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE **BEACH SAFETY: KNOW THE DANGERS**

MUD AND OUICKSAND

Large areas of the coast can have mud and quicksand which can cause you to get trapped and risk drowning.



Check tide times

Follow warning sign advice

Avoid crossing estuaries and mud where there can be hidden channels or fast water

If trapped, sit back and spread your weight evenly across the surface

Stop others from trying to help you as they may get stuck

Call 999 immediately and ask for the **Coastguard**

IF YOU SEE SOMEONE **STRUGGLING:**



CALL 999 TELL the struggling person to float on their back **THROW** them something that floats



Strong currents can sweep inflatables and people out @ to sea

FOLLOW THE FLAGS



There are lifeguards in the area. Swim between the two flags.



Do not enter the water. There could be unseen dangers such as currents.



No swimming in this area. There may be non-powered watercraft such as surfboards, kavaks, etc. in this area.

Free School Meals & Pupil Premium

Free School Meals

Your child will be eligible for free school meals if you (or your partner) are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit) and your annual gross income (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) is not more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run on' paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Universal Credit and net earnings, from your last assessment period, is not more than £616.67 per month. (If your household's net earnings change each month then they should not exceed £1,233.34 in the last two consecutive months or £1,850 in the past 3 months).

Once eligible, your child will continue to receive free school meals in primary or secondary school until the end of their current phase of education, i.e. primary (Year 6) or secondary (Year 11). After this period, you may need to reapply.

Pupil Premium

Your child's school will also receive additional funding if you are in receipt of a qualifying award listed above. It is therefore important that you claim free school meals and the pupil premium even if your child does not wish to take a school meal

Important note for parents of children in Reception, Y1 and Y2

As you are aware, all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a universal free school meal. Parents and carers who receive the qualifying benefits (listed above) should still make an application for free school meals. This is because our school can get additional government funding dependent on the number of children that qualify for statutory free school meals (based on your entitlement to certain benefits and awards).

Even if your child does not wish to take a universal free meal please still claim to enable school to get the funding.

How to Apply

You can apply online as part of your initial claim for housing benefit / council tax reduction or you can complete the separate free school meals application form. Your eligibility will be checked to claim free school meals electronically so you will not normally need to provide supporting evidence. If you are successful you and our school will be informed of the decision.
