Inter school competition was limited previously. SHAPES membership ensures entry to 5 tournaments, ranging from KS2 Boccia to KS2 multi skills. Extra curricular sports continues to be a strength. Children from Y1-Y6 are given the opportunity to participate in a range of after school sports. Professional dialogues have taken place in order to develop confidence and interest in delivering effective PE lessons.	From 2023/2024, learning walk indicated that PE was being taught effectively, children were engaged and were keen to participate and develop core skills. Data shows that most children achieve ARE for PE (2023-2024 data) and remains a positive picture when taking SEND into account. Yr 1 – 100% (25% Yr 4 = 91%, (18% above ARE) Yr 2 = 100% at ARE Yr 5 = 100% at ARE, (25% above ARE) Yr 3 = 96% (16% Yr 6 = 90% at ARE above ARE) Yr 3 = 96% (16% Yr 6 = 90% at ARE (10% above ARE) One child in Y3 doesn't access PE lessons. Attainment for SEND children is good – this also applies to previous target groups, girls and disadvantaged children.	Sports for Schools tournaments and those arranged by BM will be available to all year groups, R-Y6. Teachers will prepare children for tournaments through discrete PE sessions – e.g. children representing the school in a new age kurling competition will be given the opportunity to practise in PE.
