Y6 Residential - 25th-27th June 2025

For the children that are attending the Y6 residential in June 2025, the payment has been set up on your child's SchoolMoney account so that you can pay as much as you want, when you want, but must be paid in full by May 2025.

Spending money of $3 \times £1$ coins (in an envelope please) can be handed to the school office any time from now until May.

A meeting will be arranged for May 2025 with detailed information regarding activities, room arrangements and kit lists. You will also be able to ask any questions you may have and discuss, if necessary, any special needs.







School opening hours

Reminder - start time of the school day is 8:45am for all classes.

Doors will open at 8:40am and it is expected that all children are settled for registration at 8:45am.

Classroom doors will be closed at 8:55am and children arriving after this time will come through the office and be marked as late. Nursery 15 hours children will be collected at 11:40am, with 30 hours children being collected at 3pm. The EYFS door will remain open from 3pm- 3:15pm so Reception children can be collected.

The end of the school day for children Year 1—Year 6 is 3:15pm

Drop off and pick up for the 2 year old provision is 9AM, 12PM and 3PM

Attendance and holiday requests

The Local Authority and DFE are now working very closely with schools to ensure that all children are attending school regularly and consistently. If a child is missing school regularly or is persistently late their academic progress can be seriously jeopardised. For example; a child with a 90% attendance rate at the end of the year will have missed four whole weeks of school and 100 hours of learning opportunities. As a school, we have a threshold agreed with the LA of 95% attendance as a minimum and our School Attendance Officer will be proactive in contacting parents/carers of children whose attendance is falling below this threshold. Earrings

Clear plastic small stud earrings with safety backs are permitted in school. Parents and carers who send their child into school wearing clear, plastic, small stud earrings do so at their own risk. School will not take any responsibility to earring related injuries, or loss of earrings, with full accountability being placed upon parents and carers.

E Safety

Medical Appointments during school hours

Last year 126 school sessions were missed through pupil's medical appointments being arranged in school time. All medical appointments, including dentist and doctor's appointments, should be arranged, whenever possible, outside of school hours. Please note that in order to satisfy DFE requirements, when appointments are taken in school time, parents must provide medical evidence to support the absence for example by providing an appointment card or hospital appointment letter, clearly marked for the attention of the office staff. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

School Swimming Lessons

The swimming lessons will take place at Ashton Leisure Centre and transport will be arranged by school.

Below are the swimwear requirements.

Correct swimwear must be worn at all times.

Girls must wear a one-piece swimsuit (no two piece at all or wet suits). They will need a towel, Goggles, a cap (for long hair) and a waterproof bag.

Boys must wear swimming trunks (not loose fitting or baggy with no pockets, no Bermudas or long shorts are acceptable as these can become dangerous when the pockets become full of water). No Wet Suits a towel, a cap (for long hair) and a waterproof bag.

No Jewellery to be worn including all types of earrings.

Any child attending the pool without the correct equipment will not be allowed to swim.

Any armbands/floats etc will be provided.

Uniform Orders

New uniforms can be ordered through school. Uniform order forms are available from the dispenser in the entrance hall and on Chapel End website, in the virtual office. Please return your orders to school, we will then add the cost of your order onto your child's **SchoolMoney** account to enable you to make payment. Please write your child's name clearly on the order form, as this will be printed on the label inside the garments you order. Please ensure the form is completed correctly i.e. size and item required.



Winter Uniform



After the half term holiday all children should be in full winter uniform.

Boys Uniform

Red round-neck school jumper preferably displaying the Chapel End Primary School emblem.

White polo T-shirt

Grey trousers

Plain grey socks

Black school shoes

Girls Uniform

Red round-neck school jumper or red school cardigan preferably displaying the Chapel End Primary School emblem.

White polo T-shirt

Plain grey pinafore, grey skirt (appropriate length) or grey trousers

Grey tights

Grey socks (recommended for winter)

Black school shoes

Haircuts

We do not permit children to have extreme haircuts such as shaved patterns or Mohican styles which cause a distraction to learning, as they are inappropriate for the school setting. Any child, male or female, with long hair length will be asked to tie their hair up.

Hair Accessories

We ask that hair accessories such as headbands, clips, bows and bobbles are red or black in colour. Please also ensure that they are kept to an acceptable size and keep them as plain as possible.

Nursery

Children of nursery age are permitted to wear black or grey jogging trousers to support gross motor skill activities and toilet training.







<u>Underlayers</u>

Due to the weather becoming colder, we would like to remind parents and carers that children can wear underlayers sometimes referred to as 'skins' beneath their normal uniform or PE kit.







Little Children, Big Feelings (non-accredited)



5 weeks

Who is this course for?	This is a short non-accredited course is for adults aged 19+. It is for learners who want to help their children develop the skills they need to deal with challenges and setbacks with confidence.
What will I learn?	The course will explore the benefits of raising resilient, confident children in emotionally safe environment. You will learn how to help children label their emotions and develop ways to help them deal with difficult emotions.
Is there a cost?	This course is free to all learners
What are the course entry requirements?	No previous experience is necessary.
How long will it take?	The course usually runs for 2.5 hours per week for 5 weeks. Start dates vary.
How will I learn?	You will take part in a variety of learning activities including class discussions. You may be asked to complete some learning activities outside of the classroom. You will have an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) which will allow you to reflect on each session and tell us what went well and where you might need more practice. Your tutor will also give you written and verbal feedback on your progress.
What will I be able to do at the end of the course?	You will be able to recognise ways to build resilience and confidence in children and use a range of strategies to support their emotional well-being. You will help them develop problem-solving skills and encourage a positive mindset to build self-esteem.
	If you are interested in supporting/working with children aged 0-5 years, we offer the Entry 3 Level in Caring for Children, with progression onto the Level 1 Award/Certificate in Caring for Children, here at ACL.
Z Z	(If you are interested in working in schools, we also offer the Level 2 Supporting Teaching and Learning, which would prepare you to work in schools and college settings.)


