

New Wraparound Care Arrangements

Early Bird Club - Early Bird Club runs from 7.30-8.50am each morning.

Buzz Club - Buzz Club runs from 3.15-5.30pm each evening.

Parents and carers will be required to book <u>ALL</u> of their wraparound care sessions for a half term before the half term begins. These sessions will need to be paid <u>in full</u> before half term begins. If the sessions are not used they will not be refunded. The cost of these sessions remain at £6 for breakfast club and £8 for afterschool care.

Once half term begins, parents can book any available remaining places, however any place booked at this point would be charged at a rate of ± 10 .

Winter Uniform



This half term all children should now be in full winter uniform.

Boys Uniform

<u>Haircuts</u>

We do not permit children to have extreme haircuts such as shaved patterns or Mohican styles which cause a distraction to learning, as they are inappropriate for the school setting. Any child, male or female, with long hair length will be asked to tie their hair up.

Hair Accessories

We ask that hair accessories such as headbands, clips, bows and bobbles are red or black in colour. Please also ensure that they are kept to an acceptable size and keep them as plain as possible.

Nursery

Children of nursery age are permitted to wear black or grey jogging trousers to support gross motor skill activities and toilet training.
